French Lentil, Barley, & Chicken Soup From Woodbridge Creek Vineyard and Winery (courtesy of Velma Freudenthal)

2 cups cooked, shredded chicken

2 tsp. olive oil

3 oz. chopped pancetta

3 ribs celery, diced

2 carrots, diced

1 medium onion, diced

5 cloves garlic, chopped

3 Tbsp. tomato paste

1 cup red wine

6 cups low sodium beef stock (I used Pacific Foods

Organic Beef Stock)

2 Tbsp. dried Italian seasonings (I started with half and added until I liked it)

4 Tbsp. freshly chopped oregano (I used half)
Salt

Freshly ground pepper

1 cup French lentils, rinsed (they are small, dark bluegreen and don't get too soft)

1 cup medium pearl barley

To prepare the soup, heat a large soup pot over mediumhigh heat. Add the olive oil, pancetta, celery, carrots, and onion. Sauté for 5 minutes. Add the garlic, and sauté for 1 minute. Add the tomato paste and stir until well combined. Stir in the wine and the stock. Add the dried and fresh herbs, salt, and pepper. Add the lentils and barley, and bring to a boil.

Reduce the heat to medium low, and add the chicken. Cover and simmer until the barley and lentils are tender, stirring occasionally, about 1 hour. If the soup is too thick, add a little water. (I added some chicken stock I had.)

The 2010 Quilt Challenge Alphabet Soup

Reminders:

...The three letters that you drew must represent the three fabric colors you choose to make your guilt.

- ...Use no more than two words to describe your color. The first word of your color name has to start with the letter.
- ...Use solids, marbles, batiks, monochromatic prints, to represent your color name. No multicolored prints. Use piecing or appliqué techniques to construct your quilt.
- ...Thread or three dimensional fabric parts may only be used to embellish your quilt. Quilting and embellishments must be in threads using at least one of your fabric colors.
- ...The quilt must be at least 18" sq. up to 36" sq. (it does not have to be square but must comply with these measurements.)
- ...Guild members will judge the quilts at the June and July meetings. Members will be reminded to judge your quilt by how well it complies with the challenge requirements.

Turn In Instructions:

- ...You must tell me by the May Guild meeting, May 13, 2010, that you will be entering your quilt in the challenge. You may call or email me if you will not be at the May meeting.
- ...Add the 4" hanging sleeve. (Directions are on the web site.)
- ...Fill out the quilt show insurance waiver form. Add Alphabet Soup Challenge after your quilt name on the label and receipt form. Attach the label to the back of your quilt as per the entry instructions. Besides the paper label, it's a good idea to have your name on a separate label that you sew onto your quilt back. Do not put your name on the front of the quilt!
- ...Attach a 3x5 card with your draw number, quilt name, color names and a 1" square swatch of the fabric representing each color to the lower right front of the quilt. It won't be judged if it does not have the 3x5 card with all information attached. The quilt name should reflect your Alphabet Soup color names. Also include a 2"x6" strip of each fabric with your quilt and entry form in the bag.
- ...Bring the quilt to the June Guild meeting in a plain bag. If you are unable to attend the June meeting, please make arrangements to have someone else bring it for you. I will sign your receipt form when you turn in your quilt. (You will need to show the receipt when you pick up your quilt after the show.) The quilts will be judged at both the June and July meetings.

QUILT SHOW GRAB BAGS

Gretchen Jolie is collecting for grab bags so please bring her your donations. They should be able to fit into a small lunch sack.

Are you collecting items for the Quilt Show grab bags? If not, now is the time to start. Put a sack or box near your quilting space and donate any of the following:

- 1. Sewing and quilting notions: tape measurers, needles, thimbles, glue sticks, pincushions, pins, etc.
- 2. Thread and yarn: full or partial spools/balls for machine or hand use.
- 3. Cotton fabric: any size from fat eighths to several yards. Please cut them in rectangles, not irregularly shaped pieces.
- 4. Printed cotton panels for craft projects (such as Santa cutouts): these may be irregularly cut if you used only part of the designs and enough is left over for someone else to use.
- 5. Trims and embellishments: laces, eyelets, ribbon, packages of beads, buttons, etc.
- 6. Patterns for quilting projects or craft patterns, new or used.
- 7. Quilting magazines
- 8. Quilting related books
- 9. Office supplies: unused pencils and pens, rulers, colored pencils, erasers.
- 10. Stationery: small note pads, greeting cards, packets of invitations.
- 11. Knick-knacks: small picture frames, vases, coasters, Christmas ornaments, decorative boxes, magnets.
- 12. Beauty supplies: unopened bottles of shampoo, lotion, creams, bubble bath, wrapped bars of soap.
- 13. Children's items: small puzzles, plastic toys, bottles of bubble soap, small unused stuffed toys, crayons, pages of stickers, small books, matchbox cars, etc.
- 14. Men's items: All I can suggest right now is the stud finder I see on John's desk.

This is a good way of clearing out your drawers and cupboards – and making room for new fabric, notions, etc. Just put your things in a bag or box and bring it to a meeting. There will be a donation collection box at all future OCQG membership meetings.

2010 QUILT SHOW CATEGORIES

The Quilt Show will have NEW and DIFFERENT categories for 2010. Since there are no monetary awards for the winning quilts anymore, we thought it would be great to offer more prize ribbons. So, we have changed many of the categories and added some new ones. Here is a list of the categories:

Large Quilts, assembled and quilted by exhibitor, 275" and larger outside dimension.

Pieced - predominant construction technique Appliqué - predominant construction technique Hand Quilted – Pieced and/or appliqué

Large Quilts, assembled by exhibitor, quilted by a professional or other second party, 275" and larger outside dimension.

Pieced - predominant construction technique

Appliqué - predominant construction technique

Medium Quilts, assembled and quilted by exhibitor, 150-274" outside dimension

Pieced - predominant construction technique Appliqué - predominant construction technique Hand Quilted – Pieced and/or appliqué

Medium Quilts, assembled by exhibitor, quilted by a professional or other second party. 150-274" outside dimension

Pieced - predominant construction technique Appliqué - predominant construction technique

Small Quilts, assembled by exhibitor, quilted by exhibitor or professional, less than 150" outside dimension

Pieced - predominant construction technique Appliqué - predominant construction technique Hand Quilted – Pieced and/or appliqué

Group Quilts assembled or quilted by 3 or more people, such as block exchange quilts, group hand quilted quilts (Bayshore, Knotty Ladies, etc.). **Miniature Quilts**, NOT just a small quilt, but a miniature version of a larger quilt. If blocks are used, they must not be larger than 4". Not to exceed 120" outside dimension.

Innovative/Art Quilts, an original design, a creative interpretation, something different. Not made from a published pattern. **Miscellaneous**, garments, purses, totes, table runners, pillows, etc.

Quilts such as the Challenge and Row Robin ones will be on display only and will have a spot on the entry form to designate them. If you should have any questions about the new categories, Virginia and Jane will be available at Table Walk and Breaks during the meetings. WE HOPE EVERY ONE OF YOU WILL FIND A CATEGORY TO ENTER A QUILT IN FOR OUR "20TH ANNUAL SHOW".

We still need some of the committees filled. Most important are advertising (gathering advertisers for the programs), publicity (contacting publications, web sites, etc. to help get the word out about the show), demonstrations (coordinating demos by vendors and members at the show), flyer distribution (placing flyers at various venues around our area), hanging committee (helping to make the decisions about which quilt hangs where). These are all very necessary positions that need to be filled to make our quilt show successful. Think about taking one of them on, or just helping with one of them.

Let's make our 20th anniversary quilt show one of the best, with lots of beautiful quilts and lots of member participation. *Jane, Jackie and Virginia*

Quilt Show News

Our 20th Quilts by the Sea is right around the corner, how is your quilting going? We are looking forward to some fantastic quilts to show.

If you have always wanted to "PICK A WINNER", this is your first chance to do that. You just have to think up a category that interests you and for \$10 you name a category and choose a winner, the ribbon is provided. The only rule is: You can't select your own quilt or a family member's. Non-members can also choose a category for \$15 which includes 1 free pass to the guilt show. We would like you to "PICK YOUR WINNER" on Thursday, August 5, 4-6pm or Friday, Aug 6, 9-11 am. Come up with some really creative ideas for your winning category. The ones taken so far are: You Made Me Say, WOW, Through the Eyes of an Outdoorsman, The Crayon Box, I Wish I Had Time To Do That!, Beethoven's Best, Here Fishy-Fishy, Beautiful Garden, Au Blue, Puppy Dogs and/or Kitty Cats. Do you think you have time to whip up a guilt for one of these categories? Contact the Quilt Show Co-chairs with any questions or sign up at the May or June meetings. Your name and categories will be listed in the program as a sponsor.

Speaking of the program, we have been selected to receive a grant from the Siletz Tribe to help pay for the printing of our program and a Hints and Tips Booklet to be given away at the Quilt Show. We are lucky to have the tribe support our community in so many ways.

Do you have a technique or something that you might demonstrate at the quilt show? Instead of bed turning this year we are going to have more demonstrations. There are several lined up already, but we could still use a few more.

Also, please start going through your drawers and closets looking for items that may go in the grab bags. They do not need to be sewing related and items for kids and men are needed as well.

Remember, Nan would be very happy to get your early registration form for any quilt you will be showing. The quilt doesn't have to be finished yet; you just need a picture of the top and the colors of the backing.

Guild Pillow Project

Information on pillow size and stuffing instructions are now on the guilds website under "Activities", so if you need to be sure on the measurements just go there.

For those of you without Internet capabilities, I'll

recap that info here. Guild members may make pillows as a service project for Pacific Communities Hospital in Newport. They are given to patients being discharged, and we share this effort with the hospital Auxiliary group. This is a great way to use up orphan blocks or blocks you are practicing for a future project.

blocks you are practicing for a future project. The desired size is from 11-14" square, with 13" being the most popular size. These pillows are only lightly stuffed. The hospital provides the stuffing and it is available at our regular meetings at the Community Quilt table.

A second size pillow is now needed by the hospital dialysis center. These pillows should be 16-18" long and ten inches wide and need to be firmly stuffed, again with hospital-provided stuffing. Completed pillows should be turned in to Community Quilts since they keep track of how many we have created and they also deliver them to the hospital. Patients love our pillows!

Toledo Quilting Events – Helper(s) Needed!

<u>Saturday</u>, <u>May 8</u> is the date for the Toledo quilt show. Guild member Monica Lyons is the chairperson for the event. She has requested that OCQG do a bed turning at the Toledo History Center. She'd also like some of our quilts to hang in various Toledo stores. We will be able to display our raffle quilt and sell tickets as well as to showcase our community quilt efforts. One or two guild members are needed to organize the bed turning and help with gathering quilts, etc.

<u>Sunday, August 1</u> is the Antique Fair in Toledo. Monica Lyons at Quilter's Cottage in Toledo would like to display our Sesquicentennial quilt replicas, advertise the OCQG quilt show (which is the following weekend), and again display the raffle quilt/sell tickets. She has "rented" the street in front of her shop, Quilters Cottage, for this purpose. Again, one or two guild members are needed to coordinate our portion of this event.

This is a good opportunity to put our guild in the limelight and further our aims. If you —and maybe a friend—are willing to coordinate this portion of the Antique Fair, please **call Monica at 541-336-2877**, or stop by the shop to tell her that you'll be the point of contact.

2010 RAFFLE QUILT TICKETS ARE WAITING GET YOURS NOW!!

Many of you have picked up your 15 guilt raffle tickets. but some have not. This is a friendly reminder to those who are still without tickets to turn to your left, take two or three steps, and check in at the raffle ticket table after signing into this month's guild meeting. Judie and Karen are anxious to sign tickets out to you. Remember that you must ask for your tickets from us at a guild meeting and that we really would like to have the payment back as soon as possible. We will mail tickets to you ONLY upon request and at extra expense to the guild. Within the next few weeks we will be sending email reminders and making phone calls to individuals who have not yet picked up tickets. We sometimes forget that the annual raffle quilt revenues are a huge piece of the guild's revenue stream and without them many of our important programs and projects would not be possible. April 8, 2010 General Membership Meeting Minutes

President Jean Amundson called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm.

Announcements: Jean reminded members to turn their cell phone to vibrate or turn off the ringer.

- Quilter's Cottage: Quilt Show May 8th in Toledo. Monica would like us to enter our quilts in the show. She is sponsoring a bus to Sister's Quilt Show. It is \$25.00 prepaid.
- 2010 Challenge Quilt: Marylynn discussed the rules for the challenge. She needs a commitment to complete the challenge by the May Meeting. The quilts must be turned in at the June meeting in a brown paper bag without your name on the bag. She has an envelope for each participant that includes the rules and label instructions. She needs you to complete the waiver form found on our website since she'll be storing the quilts until the Quilt Show.
- Retreat Sign-ups: 36 members have paid, 7 have indicated interest but not yet paid. The will be a surcharge for special meals of \$5.00 per day per person that needs the special meals.
- Finance: The committee chairs have been emailing and calling members who have yet to pick up their raffle tickets.
- Relay for Life: Family Fabrics in Waldport and Western Title in Newport have blocks. There is a \$10 donation for each block. The Guild purchased 10 blocks and put the names of 25 people from the guild that have had or have cancer on the blocks.

We then had commercials for the silent auction items. And round one of the buying frenzy began.

After the first round of the buying frenzy, Workshops had an announcement that there were some people who have not paid for the May workshop.

- 2011 Raffle Quilt: The machine quilting was awarded to a team effort by Lisa Taylor and Mechelle Johnson.
- Quilt Show: The next meeting will be April 15 at 1:15 at the Carriage House. Flyers are available for distribution. The Quilt Show board accepted Umpqua Bank as a sponsor. They provided \$250 in cash and almost the same value in water and cups. They placed the banks logo on the flyers for the sponsorship. They are accepting Sponsor Awards at \$10 per sponsor. We had one final round of bidding and then the bidding closed at 8:08 with the owners of the merchandise collecting their money from the winning bidder.




