Indigo Blues

This past year the Fiber Artisan group at Latimer has been exploring the fascinating world of Indigo. The blue dye is a botanical gift from nature for every continent except the far north and south. There are many plants called "Indigo", most are botanically unrelated. At Latimer we have been exploring Japanese Indigo (Persicaria tinctoria) an annual in the buckwheat family. It grows well in our temperate climate. A barrel of Japanese indigo grows in front of Latimer. The signature blue comes from the lush leaves that look like basil on steroids. With every harvest we strip the cut stems of their leaves for the different processes to dye silk, wool fleece and cotton fiber. The stems are put in a vase of water and they quickly root and leaf out. You may be lucky enough to receive one on your visit

The gallery show will feature Indigo fiber traditions from throughout the world and here in our own backyard, including Indian Sari, Japanese kimono, American jacket, patch work quilts, coverlets and paper weaving (Shifu) Shibori, Katazome, Boro and Sashiko.

Karen Illman Miller, Katazome Textile Artist will be giving a three day intensive workshop July 17, 18, 19 and sharing items from her collection in the gallery.

Come and learn what we have learned from the rarest color in nature, INDIGO.

A 3 day workshop on Katazome the art of Japanese stencil indigo dyeing, will be offered at Latimer July 17, 18, & 19. The class will be taught by Karen Miller, a well known Katazome artist. Cost of the class will be \$200 plus \$45 for materials, with dyes and use of Japanese brushes provided. Class size is limited to 12 students. Students will learn to make stencils and dye fabric with indigo and/or colored dyes. There is still room for a couple of students. Call Kim at Latimer if you are interested.

Grants Received

Latimer has received a loan as part of the Payroll Protection Program provided by the Small Business Administration Covid-19 relief program. We received \$6800 to support payroll for our employees. If used according to the guidelines (which Latimer will have no problem doing) it will be a 100% forgivable loan.

We also have a grant pending with Oregon Community Foundation. We have no idea when we will hear back on that one, so fingers crossed....it is also a COVID-19 Emergency relief grant.

\$1000 was received from the High School Charity Drive to give support due to Covid-19.

The Oregon Quilt Project has finished it's project and has shared \$2,640.12 with Latimer.
