
#### On The Tightwire—Exhibit by High Fiber Diet

What is the tightwire that you are walking on? Life is full of balancing acts. Often one teeters on the line between things in conflict. They may be literal, personal, political, ecological, financial, temporal, or artistic. To walk the tightwire requires one to be bold, daring, and free from fear.

The exhibit currently has 21 pieces of art, including three 3-D pieces. In addition to that, there are two pieces from the juror that we would like hung with the show in their own area.







We just can't seem to warm up around here. Getting a lot of sewing done and some spring cleaning too! Here's an article I ran across about cheddar orange and it's use in quilts. We have several in our collection at Latimer with that color.



Cheddar Quilts.....

"Orange you glad you asked?"

Say cheddar orange to several quiltmakers and you'll get quite different reactions: "Love the color!" or "Hate it!". Everyone has an opinion on cheddar when it comes to quilts.

Cheddar is enjoying a recurrence of popularity but it was not always the quiltmaker's darling. In the far east, saffron, tumeric and jackfruit rind had long been used to dye cotton various shades of gold and orange, but until the 1700's people in Europe and England primarily used weld to achieve a yellow dye for linen and wool. Early shades of the yellow family were seldom durable and dying cotton was difficult.

By the 1820's chromium orange was starting to appear on cotton prints in England, France and the United States. We recognize chromium orange today as we look at prints from 1850 to 1880 in old quilts.

The classic combination of cheddar, indigo blue, forest green and oxblood brown against a white background has made for spectacular color schemes in quilts made between 1860 and 1900.

Orange and cheddar faded to various pastel shades in the 1920's and 1930s and were used in novelty feed sack prints.

The color we call cheddar was possible in textiles, including cotton, from the 1840's on. That did not mean it was always fashionable for dress goods. That is the simple truth as to why shades of gold and orange do not appear in much 19th-century clothing. The powerful arbiters of fashion had advised their readers not to indulge. While dressmaking scraps were often used to make patchwork quilts, that does not seem to hold true for cheddar.

Well, there you go, everything you always wanted to know about cheddar orange.






