Gail Barker - Case Manager for Confederate Indian of Siletz Tribe – So very thankful for the quilts that we as a guild have provided. They are a cuddly art piece that sends the message their cared for. Shared information about the struggles with in the Confederated Indian Tribal community for the children. Currently locally we have 20 kids in care. Will get us a list of good omens symbols for the Tribal community.

Lynn Moody – Baby project with Samaritan Pacific Coast Hospitals – quilts, burp clothes, and receiving blankets. Approx. 100 quilts in the last 1.5 years.

Nancy Hoover – Spoke about the need to have help this year with 45 to 50 Head Start quilts (an effort that our beautiful late Barb Martin was the largest contributor and will be missed). These quilts stay with a child until they go on to elementary school. These quilts are washed often and very loved for many years by these children.

Sarah Cole – Manager of Labor and Delivery at PCH relayed how very thankful and appreciated all the gifts the new families receive from our gifts of burp clothes, receiving blankets, and quilts. She noted that we have a large Guatemalan community and the new mothers from that community are so greatly appreciative of the quilts for their new babies.

Committee Reports

2026 Challenge Quilts: Darcy de la Rosa. – Semi-quincentennial – America Beautiful (National Park or Monument or Scenic Wonder) 102” in circumference. Must have a flag on it anywhere on the quilt (front, back or label, binding.) Due by July 1, 2026. Check the website if you have questions.

Community Quilters – Nancy Hoover – Donated to SPCH: 22 seat belt pillows, 15 (9”x9”) pillows, 13 hospital pillows, 8 baby quilts, 2 receiving blankets, 10 knitted baby caps, 65 burp clothes
